How to get to Knjaževac?

As one of the most visited towns in Serbia, bearing in mind that it is situated in the vicinity of Stara Planina skiing resort, Knjaževac is very well connected and easily accessible from all corners of the world.

Travelling by air

Visitors travelling from Europe will find direct or connecting flights from most European cities to Nikola Tesla Airport in Belgrade, the major airline hub of Eastern Europe. Similarly, visitors can fly low-cost airlines like Wizzair or Ryanair to nearby Constantine the Great Airport in Niš or Sofia Airport in Sofia, Bulgaria.

Travelling by car

Serbia has an extensive public transport network and Knjaževac is easy to reach using the E-75 motorway from Belgrade to Niš and taking the state road from Niš to Knjaževac (a 60 km distance).

Where to stay?

Knjaževac offers a variety of comfortable accommodation at affordable prices ranging from private homes to private-owned hotels. Our best recommendation is Timok Hotel located in the town centre providing an excellent accommodation and service.
